### HISTORY COMES TO LIFE FOR CHILDREN IN YEAR 3 AND 6

This term has already started to be a memorable experience for Year 3 and Year 6 children. Their Curriculum has been enhanced by a real historical expert explaining to Y3 about life in the Stone Age, while Year 6 learned about Crime and Punishment across the years!

The Year 6 children were introduced to their new History topic, WOW lesson was a special visit by a Victorian Police officer! It was a fantastic day, where the children learnt about everything from Anglo Saxon and Viking punishments, to the present day police force. The particular highlights were the chance to sit in the stocks, dress up in all the different police costumes over the last 200 years and create some police face-fits of some of the Year 6 staff. The children can't wait to continue learning about the topic throughout the rest of this term.

Year 3 had a fantastic experience learning about history going back to over 5 million years ago. They held artefacts and gained an understanding of how and why they were made. They had some opportunities to try some "Stone Age food" and ventured deep into the caves to also create cave paintings. Many fascinating questions and insightful questions were asked and answered!
