


1. Are you aware that in September 2020, the education of Relationships and Health education will be statutory in Primary Schools?




2. Are you aware that your child has already been learning about Relationships and Health in their PSHE lessons?


3. How important do you feel it is for children to learn about Relationships at school? 72 responses



4. How important do you feel it is for children to learn about Health (physical and mental






5. Have you read the school draft policies for Relationships and Education (RHE) and Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) on our website?




6. If you have read our draft policies, are you satisfied with the amount of information provided about your child's education in Relationships and Health? ³⁵ responses




7. How much do you agree with the following statement: 'I am fully aware of what my child will learn about in Relationships and Health education.' 72 responses

Radio 2 had a phone in about child grooming and drugs .


