INTRODUCING THE GOVERNORS OF NORWOOD

In the most recent Parental Survey, it was noted that a majority of parents would like more information about Norwood's Governing Body.

The role of the Governing Body is to provide strategic management of the school, to oversee the financial performance, to act as a "critical friend" and also support the work of the Head Teacher and other staff.

There are currently 14 Governors: the Head Teacher and Deputy Head; five are **co-opted** for their specific skills and experience; five are **parents** of children; one represents the **staff** and one represents the **Local Authority.** The Chair of the Governors is Mrs. L. Lee and the Vice-Chair is Mr. C. Stewart.

Governors bring a wide range of experiences and skills and have key roles in monitoring how the school and the staff are performing. They also meet half-termly as the whole body, to ensure that Norwood is maintaining its ethos and values as well as continuing to improve your children's education.

The most recent meeting, held on Thursday 24th October, discussed the following items:

- The support offered by the school to pupil's following the summer incidents in Southport
- A review of the performance in external tests
- An evaluation of the School Development Plan 2023-24
- The current staffing structure
- The Parent Survey
- Safeguarding, Finance and Curriculum
- Agreeing the following policies: Complaints; Child Protection/Safeguarding and Attendance/Punctuality
