HOW WE SUPPORT ATTENDANCE AT NORWOOD

Attendance and punctuality is monitored <u>every month</u> by Mr. Dumbell and Mrs. Taylor and <u>every half-term</u> by the Governors to ensure that children are given the best opportunity to learn and achieve - <u>by being in school regularly.</u>

It is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure that your child is in school.

What parents MUST do: Telephone the school before 8.30am to report your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance of any medical appointments.

Let school know if your child is feeling a bit under the weather, as they often perk up on arrival. (Vomiting and diarrhoea have the 48 hour rule) If your child is struggling with school attendance, talk to us. We can help!

What school MUST do: Check your child's attendance every day and explore the reasons.

Contact you about your child to ensure that they are SAFE.

Let you know if your child's attendance drops to below a certain level. Offer support if there is a particular issue behind the low attendance. Invite you into school for attendance support meetings if we're concerned. Refer your child's continuing low attendance to Sefton Education and

Welfare Department.

Refer parents who have taken term time holidays repeatedly to Sefton's Education and Welfare Department, who will issue penalty notices.
